Natalie and Tom will share stories about searching for lichens in Pennsylvania and across the U.S. After this talk, they hope you will notice more of the dazzling lichen diversity while on your fungal forays, fishing trips, or other adventures.

FOR THE POTLUCK, bring something for 6-8 people, along with serving utensils. It does not need to be mushroom related but, if so, wild mushrooms must be identified and approved by a club Identifier or Mycologist before cooking, and any non-members will have to sign a waiver before trying them. Since electrical connections are limited, bring hot food hot, and bring cold food cold. WPMC will provide soft drinks, plates, eating utensils, napkins, and take-home boxes.

WPMC meetings are held on the third Tuesday evening of each month from March through November at the Frick Environmental Center. Each meeting features updates on club activities, a speaker/presentation, mushroom identification table, and mushroom-related merchandise for sale. Meetings are free and open to the public.

Guests Mycologists Noah Siegel and Barrie Overton

DR. BARRIE OVERTON is a professor of biology at Lock Haven University (now part of Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania), where he teaches Biology and Mycology courses. His areas of expertise include plant pathology, identification of wild edible mushrooms, and White-Nose Syndrome (WNS) in hats



WNS is a fatal disease, caused by *Pseudogymnoascus destructans*, a fungus that has devastated North American bat populations. At this year's Gary Lincoff Foray, Dr. Overton will talk about WNS and the new species of *Pseudogymnoascus* that he has found in Pennsylvania caves.

NOAH SIEGEL, one of the premier mushroom photographers in the nation, will present "Under Pressure: Evolution Oddities in the Fungal World." This lecture will highlight some of the fascinating traits which fungi have evolved due to environmental pressures, and the strive to get ahead in the fungal world.



Noah travels and lectures exten-

sively across America. His photographs have appeared on the covers and have been featured in articles of multiple issues of *FUNGI Magazine*, the primary mushroom enthusiast magazine in the United States, numerous mushroom books, as well as many club publications. He is currently working on *Mushrooms of Cascadia: A Comprehensive Guide to Fungi of the Pacific Northwest*.

In fact, your dish doesn't need to contain mushrooms at all; some members are allergic or sensitive to mushrooms and will need an alternative meal

Last Chance to Enter WPMC Photo Contest

THE DEADLINE IS rapidly approaching for this year's WPMC Photo Contest. Entries must be received by September 30. WPMC Identifier Sara Klingensmith will judge members' photos in four categories: Documentary, Pictorial, Judge's Option, and "Mushroom Selfies."

Here are the Photo Contest rules for this year:

- Deadline for Submissions: September 30, 2023
- Maximum of 5 Entries per WPMC member
- Submit high resolution JPEG files
- Rename images before submitting, using name and subject, e.g., "Joe Smith morel.jpg"
- Email entries to Sara Klingensmith at pamushroomclubphotos@ gmail.com.
- Indicate in your email the desired category for each photo.

You must be a member of the Western Pennsylvania Mushroom Club in good standing to enter. Club dues must be up to date. Photos submitted by non-members will not be considered.

Entry Divisions

Mushroom Selfies (New!): Entries must be single, self-taken ("selfie") cell phone photos of you with at least one mushroom. You may also include other willing people, your pets, and other animals that happen to cross the background in the photo. You may use selfie sticks, but no other person may take the photo for you.

Pictorial: This division is for single photos that illustrate the beauty and variety of fungi in form and color. The objective is a photo suitable for display or illustration in a fine book. Judging criteria include consideration of both technical (focus, depth of field, exposure, lighting, color, absence of distracting elements) and artistic (composition, color, background, lighting) aspects.

Documentary: For single photographs especially suited as illustrations in a field guide or monograph, or for use in a lecture. Emphasis is placed on portrayal of key morphological characteristics such that the usefulness of the image as an identification aid is maximized. Subjects may be shot in the field, laboratory or studio and the photographer has complete freedom to process, manipulate, or orient the specimen in any desired manner to achieve the goal. Close-ups of single features and photomicrographs are acceptable. Judging criteria will be the same as in the Pictorial category but they will be of secondary importance to the overall mycological utility of the photo. Accurate identification of the subject will be a consideration.

Judge's Option: For photos which do not fit into the Pictorial or Documentary divisions. Examples include fungi in an interesting situation, fungi with animals, people enjoying fungi.

Subject material: Organisms from the Myxomycota (slime molds), the classes Basidiomycetes and Ascomycetes of the Eumycota ("true fungi"), and Lichens are eligible. For Judge's Option, nearly anything goes, so long as the theme relates to fungi, and fungi are a key element of the photograph.

Use and copyright: WPMC may use your photographs on the website, newsletter and Mushroom Catalog and when we do. they will always be accompanied by your name as photographer (mentioned on the same page or caption of the image). WPMC will not allow the use of your photographs on other websites, although realistically we cannot prevent this. We will not sell or provide the images to others without your permission and the images remain the property and under the copyright of you the photographer and are used under license by the Western Pennsylvania Mushroom Club.

Important Walk & Foray Information

- Try to dig up three of the same species at different stages of development.
- Don't pick old mushrooms; leave them to drop spores.
- You are responsible for not getting lost. Find a buddy to search with.
- Only Club Mycologists and Identifiers should be used for identification and advice.
- Take notes and pictures to help you remember the mushrooms: location, habitat, etc.
- Whether you decide to eat a mushroom is ultimately your responsibility alone.
- Help Keep Our Parks Clean! When mushrooming, it's easy
 to bring a plastic grocery bag to collect cans, bottles or other
 trash you find. Trash cans are generally found nearby. If not,
 take it home for disposal.
