S I WRITE THIS, summer is in full swing, and we're counting down to our 25th annual Gary Lincoff Foray on September 18-20, a weekend of

mushroom walks with WPMC identifiers and talks by our keynote speakers Britt Bunyard and Matt Kasson.

This is also the perfect moment to support an exciting statewide initiative: House Bill 1090, which would make the hemlock varnish shelf (Ganoderma tsugae) Pennsylvania's official state mushroom. Led by the Pennsylvania Biological Survey's Mycological Technical Committee and endorsed by all eight of the state's mycology clubs, this bill would put Pennsylvania among only nine states with an official mushroom.

Until late September, legislators are in their home districts, making it an ideal time to contact them. Please write to your state representative and ask them to support HB 1090. If they're already a cosponsor, thank them for backing this important recognition of fungi's role in our state. If you live in an area represented on the House Tourism, Recreation & Economic Development Committee, consider inviting your representative on a mushroom walk or foray. Seeing fungi in the wild can be a powerful motivator!

2025 Meeting Schedule

SEPTEMBER 9 - When the Tables are Turned: Plants that Eat Fungi (VIRTUAL)

Fungi are regularly thought of as decomposers-plant pathogens. But they also interact with plants in ways that are beneficial. Mycorrhizal fungi are essential for plant access to nutrients and water and for protection against pathogens. Sometimes the plant is even able to parasitize the fungus.

Over 10% of plant species can get all of their nutrients from fundi for

at least part of their life. This includes all orchids, which rely completely on fungi for all nutrients from the time of seed germination until their first green leaves form. Melissa will introduce the plants that have evolved to take advantage of fungi and what it means for the ecology of both the plants and the fungi.

Since electrical connections are limited, bring hot food hot, and bring cold food cold. WPMC will provide soft drinks, plates, eating utensils, napkins, and take-home boxes.



Interview With La Monte Yarroll


WPMC MYCOLOGIST **La Monte Yarroll** spent his first five years in Papua New Guinea. "I got my first training as a naturalist at my mother's knee, as the youngest and most spoiled child of three. My mother was a primary school teacher and always had a garden and we loved to spend time outdoors. As well, I have been a hiker most of my life."

Fast forward to adulthood, when La Monte and his wife, Eve, were expecting their firstborn. He got a job at the University of Tasmania, Australia, for a Systems Programmer with a background in Category Theory. La Monte's Bachelor's thesis at The University of Chicago in Category Theory fit the bill. During his time in "Tassie", his interest in mushrooms really got started. "I saw dozens of species on every walk. My first field guide was from CSIRO Publishing, the Australian equivalent of the National Science Foundation. Lots of (the mushrooms in Tassie) were undescribed, and I saw something I wanted to do."

Upon returning to Chicago, he had a chance meeting with Leon Shernoff of the Illinois Mycological Association (IMA). Leon wanted to set up a subdomain for the IMA and invited La Monte to their next event. That's where La Monte met Patrick Leacock, PhD, Mycologist and Botanist. Pat ran the voucher program for NAMA for many years. Leon went on to become the publisher of *Mushroom: The Journal of Wild Mushrooming*.

"I was collecting mushrooms for about six years before I was interested in eating any of them. Then around 1998 we took a trip out West, and I looked behind a rest area and found a few *Boletus edulis* (King Boletes). This stranger approached me and asked, 'Where did you find those?' He picked a cooler full of them and taught me to dehydrate them on the back window of the car. I made them into a delicious soup and was hooked."

"We bought our house in Bethel Park when I took a position at Timesys in 2001. I immediately sought out a club but had to take public transportation to Beechwood Farms and bum a ride home. I loved doing the ID table right away and kept getting asked how many mushrooms I knew. After the second meeting, I got all my books out and counted the mushrooms I could ID by sight. By the third meeting, I announced that I knew 600+. [The late Past President] Dick Dougall made me a Club Mycologist on the spot."

La Monte's favorite organisms are slime molds (not

actually fungi), particularly *Stemonitis* (Chocolate tube). Regarding edibles, *Craterellus fallax* (Black Trumpet) and *Leucoagaricus americanus* (Reddening lepiota) are his favorites, and he likes making Chanterelle-Infused agave tequila.

Today La Monte is working on getting his Master's degree (anticipated completion date is May 2026). The overarching goal is to develop The Synoptic Key of Life. This project will make searchable the taxonomic descriptions in the biological literature with machine learning and make them accessible to the amateur taxonomist.

Editor's Note: La Monte Yarroll served on the WPMC Board of Directors as NAMA Trustee from 2017-2020. He won WPMC's Outstanding Service Award in both 2006 and 2017.

Last Chance to Enter 2025 Photo Contest

THE DEADLINE TO enter this year's Photo Contest is September 30. Photography Chair Sara Klingensmith will announce the winners at the October 21 meeting. Here are the Photo Contest rules for this year:

- Deadline for Submissions: September 30, 2025
- Maximum of 5 Entries per WPMC member
- Submit high resolution JPEG files
- Rename images before submitting, using name and subject, e.g., "Joe Smith morel.jpg"
- Email entries to Sara Klingensmith at pamushroomclubphotos@gmail.com.
- Indicate in your email the desired category for each photo.

You must be a member of the Western Pennsylvania Mushroom Club in good standing to enter. Club dues must be up to date. Photos submitted by non-members will not be considered.

ENTRY DIVISIONS

Advanced Pictorial: This division is for single photos that illustrate the beauty and variety of fungi in form and color. The objective is a photo suitable for display or illustration in a fine book. Judging criteria include consideration of both technical (focus, depth of field, exposure, lighting, color, absence of distracting elements) and artistic (composition, color, background, lighting) aspects.

Novice Pictorial: This division is for single photos that illustrate the beauty and variety of fungi in form and color. The objective is a photo that shows the photographer learning to use focus, depth of field, and lighting.

Documentary: For single photographs especially suited as illustrations in a field guide or monograph, or for use in a lecture. Emphasis is placed on portrayal of key morphological characteristics such that the usefulness of the image as an identification aid is maximized. Subjects may be shot in the field, laboratory or studio and the photographer has complete freedom to process, manipulate, or orient the specimen in any desired manner to achieve the goal. Close-ups of single features and photomicrographs are acceptable. Judging criteria will be the same as in the Pictorial categories but they will be of secondary importance to the overall mycological utility of the photo. Accurate identification of the subject will be a consideration.

Judge's Option: For photos which do not fit into the Pictorial or Documentary divisions. Examples include fungi in an interesting situation, fungi with animals, people enjoying fungi, and mushroom selfies.

Subject Material: Organisms from the Myxomycota (slime molds), the classes Basidiomycetes and Ascomycetes of the Eumycota ("true fungi"), and Lichens are eligible. For Judge's Option, nearly anything goes, so long as the theme relates to fungi, and fungi are a key element of the photograph.

Use and Copyright: WPMC may use your photographs on the website, newsletter and Mushroom Catalog and when we do, they will always be accompanied by your name as photographer (mentioned on the same page or caption of the image). WPMC will not allow the use of your photographs on other websites, although realistically we cannot prevent this. We will not sell or provide the images to others without your permission and the images remain the property and under the copyright of you the photographer and are used under license by the Western Pennsylvania Mushroom Club.



Fluorescent Foray at Cook Forest (Clarion County) Meet at the Log Cabin Inn Environmental Learning Center

Join WPMC Mycologists & Identifiers for an evening stroll through the Forest Cathedral. We will use 365nm UV flashlights to light up the trail and search for fungi that glow in response to ultraviolet light. Parts of the path are flatter, but some sections have steep grades of 10-17%. Expect to walk 1-2 miles, but participants can shorten the distance as needed.

Bring a headlamp, ideally with a red light, and wear sturdy footwear and weather-appropriate clothing. Participants are encouraged to bring their own UV flashlight. Leaders will provide protective eyewear. There are restrooms available near the parking lot.

There is no charge for this walk, but you will be responsible for your own transportation and lodging. We recommend staying in the area if you're attending the Fluorescent Foray and coordinating with friends to find a campsite. The Ridge Campground at Cook Forest is an affordable option.
